
### JUNE 10 HATS OFF TO OUR COMMUNITY HELPERS

## How To Earn points towards some great reading prizes.

- 25 Attend a program
- 100 Attend all programs (both regular Wed. and STEAM-y Thurs.)
- 5 Email the library a Chatterpix video book report you made
- 25 Keep the written log of all the books you read by title, author, and pages of each book. Bring your log each week to get your points for the week. If you turn the log in by July 15, you earn the 25 points.
- 1 point for each page read
- 50-100 Write an original book. Try some of the library's software and bookbinding tools.
- 25 Be a SUPER SQUAD TEAM member. You will help with various tasks during the summer.
- 10 SUPER SQUAD TEAM members help with programs. You must be on the SUPER SQUAD TEAM list to qualify **and** notify Judy ahead of time to find out what your duties will be for each particular program.
- 25 Be a "COMPANION HERO" to a resident at Cottonwood Estates. There will be at least two sessions where we will meet at the facility and read to the residents. You must sign up beforehand. More sessions can be made if there is enough interest.
- 25 Wear a ball uniform (either softball or baseball) on July 1 when the Saltdogs come.

## (REMEMBER THE SALTDOGS PROGRAM IS AT 10:30 AM July 1)

- 10 Be a GOOD NEIGHBOR HERO and do something nice and surprise your neighbor or grandparent, or our community. Have that person sign your log.
- 25 CREATIVE BOOK REPORT: Create a "report/review" of a book using various ideas we have for you. There will be instructions/suggestions sheets for you to take home. See our display.
- 10 Get your picture taken with Sherlock the Magnificent at the Saltdogs or Animal Heroes program.
- 10 Read to Sherlock. There will be different times when Sherlock will visit the library and listen to you read to him. Sign up for 30 minutes.
