I am the author of the "Cowgirl Peg" children's book series which uses real animals, mainly my horses, to teach character traits and values to young readers. I visit public, private and religious-based schools nationally, will be in your area this school year and would be honored to add your school to the schedule. Geared for elementary students, K-6th grade, the programs become more detailed with the upper grades and include writing techniques with emphasis on proof-reading and editing, plus discussion of the character-building messages in the stories.

I am aware that many schools now focus on anti-bullying programs, which is a large part of my presentation. I use examples from the books for discussion with emphasis on feelings and acceptance of differences, along with making smart choices.

I do not "charge" schools for the visit; instead I ask that the school promote the visit in advance, send my flyer/order form home with students and allow me to sign books. (Detailed in the enclosed packet.) Schools love the fact that the visit does not impact their budget. I do not pressure kids to buy books; instead, the books sell themselves. If your school has a policy against book sales, or is in a low-income area, a fee or other payment option can be arranged.

The books and messages earned the endorsement of the Executive Director of the International Reading Association (Colorado Council) & the state of Nebraska Regional Libraries. Other endorsements, credentials and referrals are included in the attached packet. Knowing I positively impact the lives of young readers is the best reward of all.





Welcome to my Book Barn!

The "Cowgirl Peg Book Series" currently includes seven entertaining books. The first six titles are written at an elementary level, but enjoyed by readers of all ages. The new, seventh book is a chapter book written for higher elementary through adult reading levels. I built the series by combining my love of horses and dogs with powerful character-building messages. Beautifully illustrated by artist Pat Wiles, the books are nationally endorsed and highly recommended by parents, young readers, educators and counselors. Leaving a positive impact in the lives of thousands of young "Cowgirl Peg" fans is the biggest reward of all!

The characters in each of the following titles are real! Actual photos of myself as "Cowgirl Peg", plus the animals in the stories, are included at the end of each book.



My first book, **LONESOME THE LITTLE HORSE**, is based on the true story of a little horse that I rescued from neglect in 2001. This beautiful book offers young readers several important lessons, including bullying/friendship and actions vs. consequences, that parents regularly explain to their children. The very popular story is used nationally in "Red Ribbon" Drug Awareness school programs.



Next, I published *ISABELLE LIVES A DREAM*, the story of a young city girl with dreams of becoming a cowgirl. Built around messages of goal-setting and responsibility, the story follows Isabelle on a journey to Cowgirl Peg's ranch where her dream comes true.



SHORTSTUFF BUCKS! arrived in 2005 as my third book. Told by the horses, this story entertains readers with humor, suspense and awesome artwork. Shortstuff teaches children to always "believe in themselves" when facing challenges and adversity.

In 2006, I wrote a book that truly came from my heart: **JAZMINE'S INCREDIBLE STORY**. This is the true story of Jazmine, the German Shepherd who became my best friend and constant companion. Previously an abused animal, she appeared in hundreds of schools with me, meeting and "kissing" more than 100,000 students. Creating her book truly tested my writing skills. It is a happy book, but delivers



a continuous, subtle message that "animals have feelings, too".




OKEY-DOKEY OAKIE joined the series in 2008. Many parents and educators requested a book that would help children deal with peer pressure. This story does that and more, including messages about respect, kindness and making smart choices. Beautifully illustrated, this animated story is filled with imaginative dialogue between Cowgirl Peg and her horses.



COWGIRL PEG & THE GREAT RACE arrived in 2011. It is a silly reunion of all the main animal characters from each of the previous books. The horses -- Lonesome, Shortstuff, Lacey, Wise Guy, Red and Okey – plus the dogs Jazmine, Harley and Muffin share a humorous adventure at the ranch. The story delivers a great message about the importance of physical exercise and healthy eating along with teamwork. It is a beautiful, entertaining book for kids and grown-ups of all ages!





My 93-year-old father encouraged me to write a mini-autobiography detailing some of the many adventures in my life. Writing about myself wasn't easy, but the more I wrote, the better it got. It ended up being a very enjoyable project that resulted in an entertaining, suspenseful book that includes great life lessons for readers. And Pat Wiles, my illustrator, created an incredible cover that is nominated for a national award.
