WiFi Use

The Schuyler Public Library provides twenty four (24) hour WiFi internet access to our patrons for use with laptops or other WiFi enabled mobile devices for web and email access.

Schuyler Public Library has laptops with WiFi capability available for in house patron use. Patrons' wishing to use library laptops will need to leave their driver's license with staff while using this equipment.

Any use of the Library's network (wired or WiFi) must be in accordance with the Library's Computer and Internet Use Policy. Any activities deemed illegal, apply to patrons whether using their own computer or a library owned computer.

Library staff can only provide a minimum amount of assistance and will not physically handle a patron's computer or device.

Be advised that you use the Library's WiFi network at your own risk. The WiFi network is not secure as it is not encrypted using WEP, WPA, etc. Unless you take additional precautions, any information you send to or from your laptop or device could potentially be intercepted by a third party who might be within range and using the appropriate hardware/software.

The Library will not be responsible for any information (i.e. credit card) that is compromised, or for any damage caused to your hardware or software due to power surges, security issues, hacking, or viruses. Anti virus and security protection are the responsibility of the patron. All WiFi access users should have up to date virus protection on their laptops or other WiFi devices.

WiFi device users are expected to be considerate of patrons nearby and are expected to use headphones or earbuds when playing movies and music.

The Library has set up a specific email to receive print jobs from patron's devices: Schuylerlibprint@yahoo.com. Patron name is

required in the subject line to indicate that particular patron's print job in the queue. Regular printing fees apply.

Parental supervision of children using the Internet is advised and parents are ultimately responsible for their children's' computer usage and activities.

The Library will not be responsible for laptops or other devices left unattended.
