





#### Senior Sneak Day

Eighteen sleepy Seniors and two sponsors left for a big day in Omaha at 4:30 Tuesday morning, March 25. After stopping in Shelby for breakfast, we went on to Boy's Town where we were taken on a tour. The eighth grade meant hard work because we all wanted to graduate into high school. That year Gail Jensen moved away, but we were joined by Jerry Davis.

We entered high school a little frightened and were called "green freshmen" by all the upper classmen. This year we lost Mary Keebaugh and Jerry Davis. Jerry Huebner, Janis Cargill, Sharon Bremer, Dorothy Duester, and Lorena Gydesen greatly enlarged our class.

In our Sophomore year we gained Marvis Beck and lost Joyce Bengel, Valgene Henton, Keith McCaslin, and Allan Bundy.

In our Junior year we began to show more serious thoughts now that we were almost seniors. We were joined by Loren Babcock, but lost Rollin Mallery and Lorena Gydesen. Jeanette Rubenthaler and Jerry Bredthauer moved away during the year.

Beginning our twelfth and final year, Rollin Mallery is back with us, but we have lost Dorothy Duester. Out of our sixteen members who started kindergarten, only nine are now in this year's graduating class. 


