Class History

Miss Wanda Ziegler was our teacher during our fifth grade in 1951. We lost Judy Farrell, Shirley Johnson and Larry Kapustka; and gained Judy Keebaugh and Maurice Shaffer.

We entered the sixth grade in 1952 under Mrs. Wanda Essman. We lost Gail Jensen and Maurice Shaffer, and we gained Eddie Landon.

In 1958, our senior year, we had the same class as we had had in our junior year—five girls and 10 boys.

Of those who started in 1946, only Ruby Clement, Sandra Gydesen, Jerry Johnson and Roger Davis are with us now.

On May 15, 1959, we seniors received our diplomas, which marked the end of our wonderful high school days at Scotia Consolidated Schools.

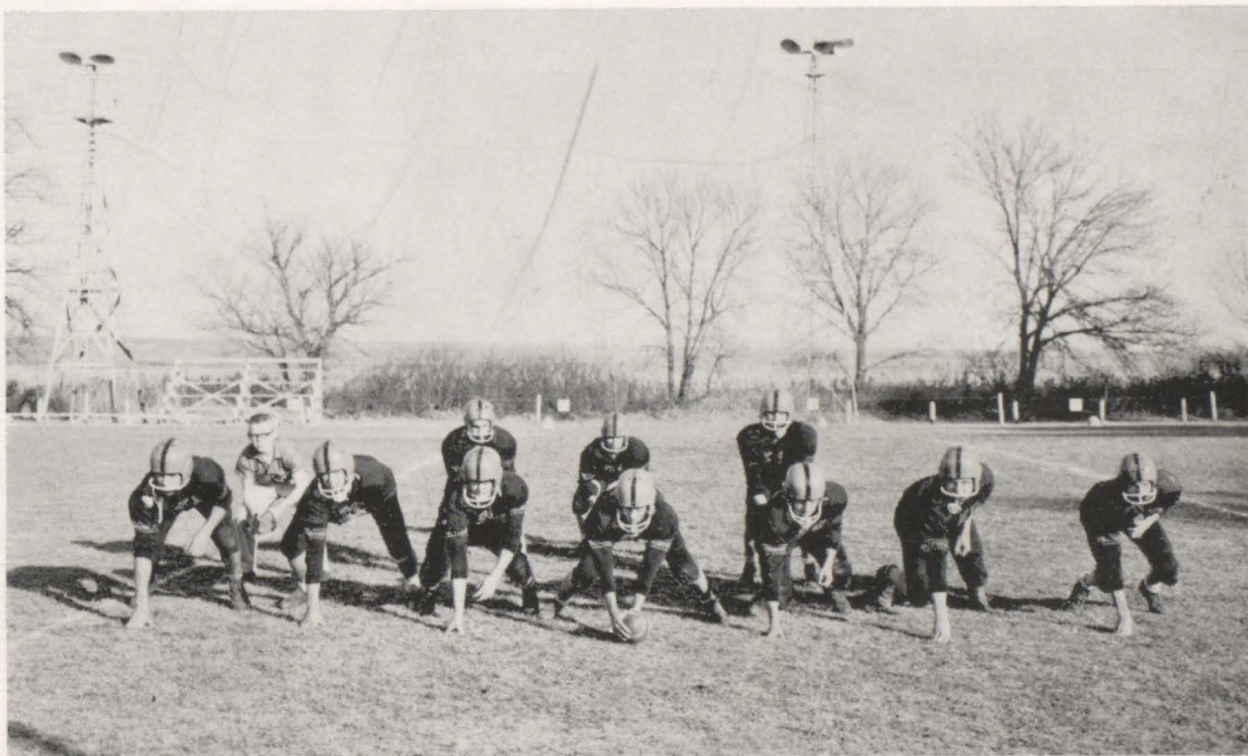
