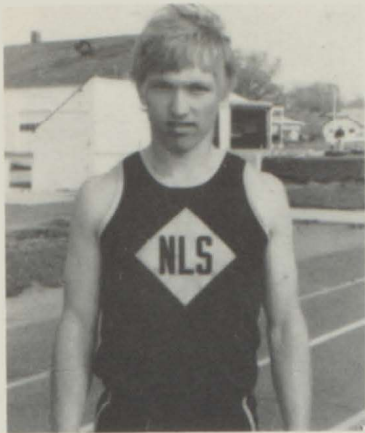


The NLS boys track team had a good year. School records were set in the 200, 400 relay, 1600 relay, and the 800.

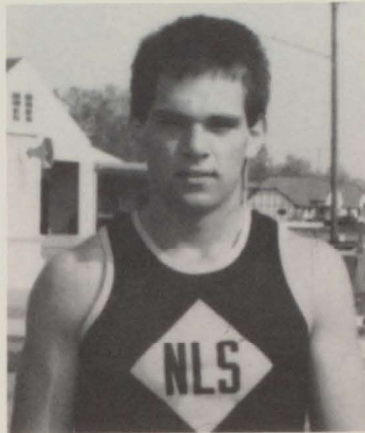

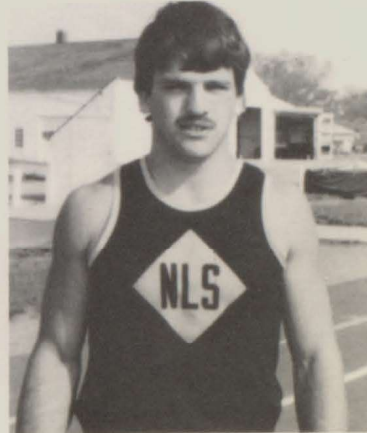

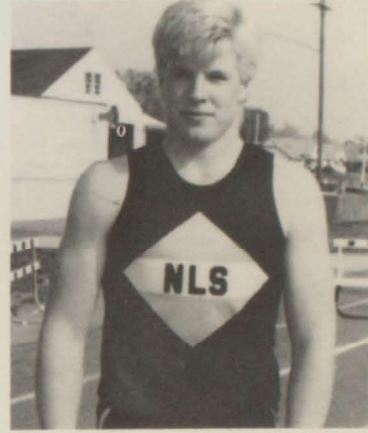
