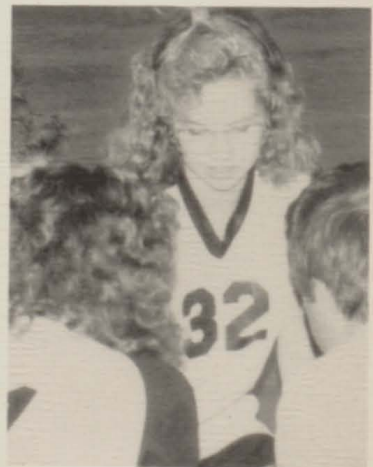

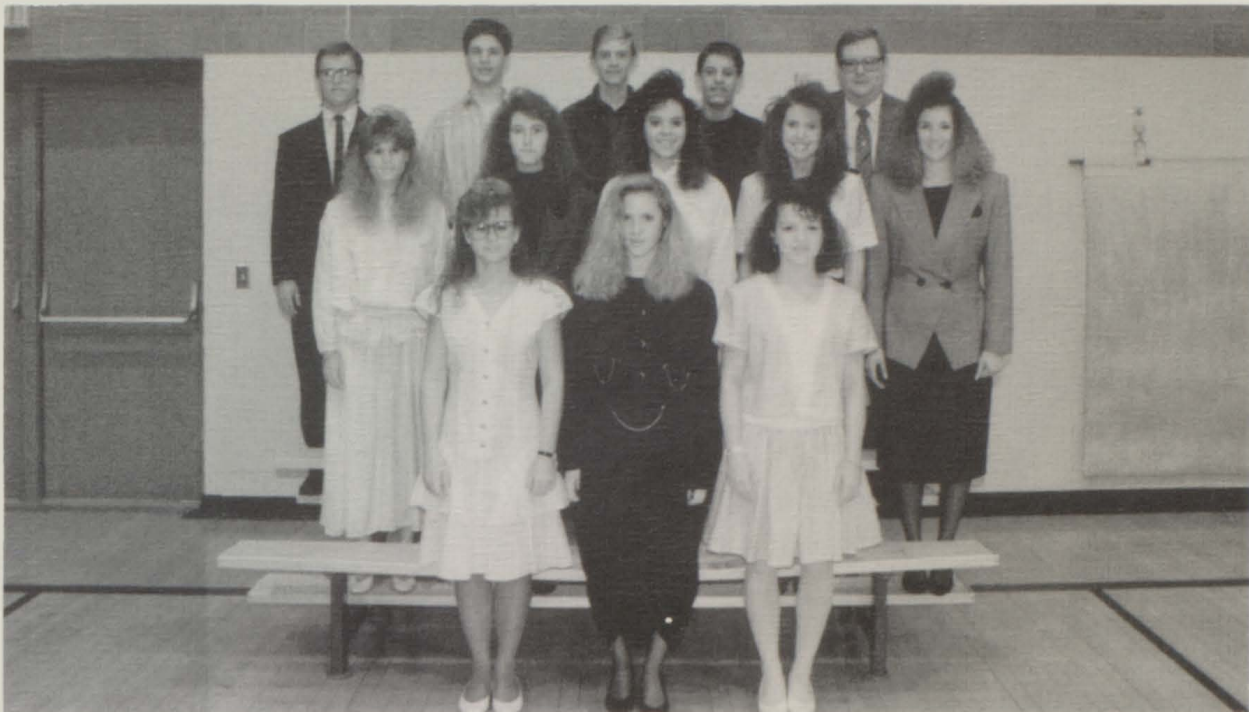

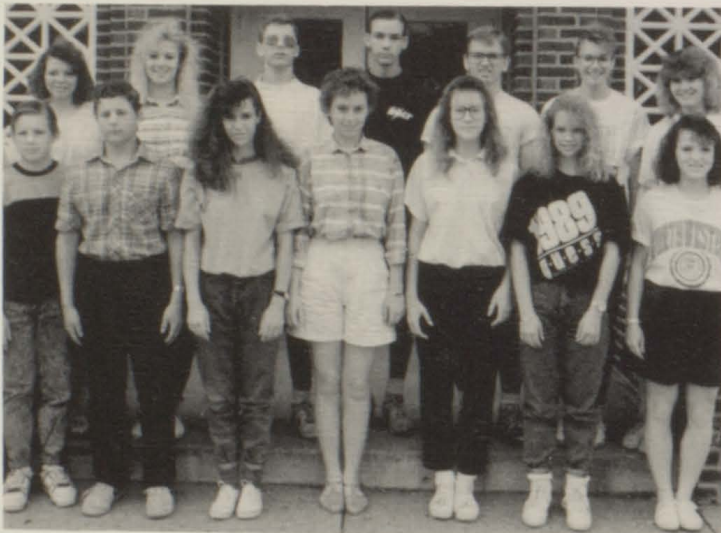

At Honors Night many people were awarded for their talents and for being in activities. The 1990-1991 cheerleaders, flag girls, and majorette were announced.

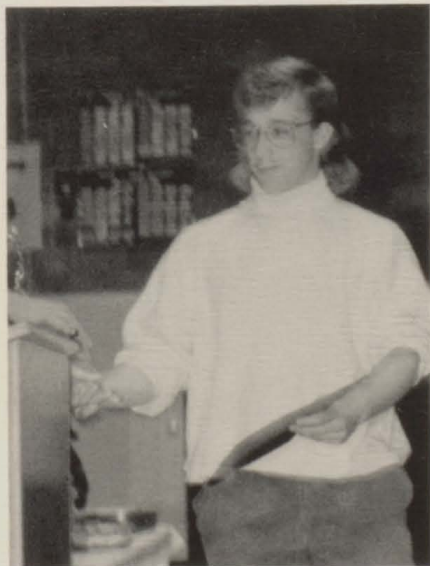

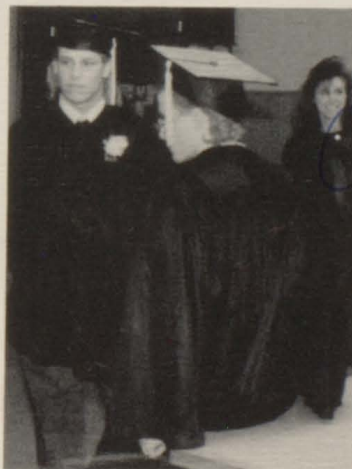
