The Wildcats ended their season with a very impressive record of 22-2. The starting line up consisted of 2 seniors, 1 junior, and 2 sophomores. Glen Snodgrass, a 6'6" Senior, ended with 572 points, 335 rebounds, and 159 blocked shots for the season. The Wildcats won their first trip to the state tournament this year. Their first opponent at State was Wauneta Palisade which was easily won by the Wildcats. On to the semi-finals they went. It was a close semi-final victory for Sterling at Pershing Auditorium, barely getting by the Cats, 56-55 that kept the Cats from their championship dream. Although the Wildcats didn't take home the State Runner-Up Trophy, they were ranked #2 in C-2 in the Omaha World-Herald, and in the Lincoln Journal Star. They were also ranked #2 in Class C in the G.I. Independent. The Wildcats did earn the District, Conference Season and Tournament Trophies. Among many honors given to members of the North Loup-Scotia basketball team Glen Snodgrass was 1st Team All State and Coaches All-State. Matt Kern received Honorable Mention All State. Matt and Glen were also All Conference Players. Bob Sixel was Honorary Coach All Area KNLV.








#### The Senior Play: "No Opera
