


Fireside Chat Book Discussion

Sour Cream Pumpkin Bundt Cake

Streusel

1/2c packed brown sugar
1 tsp cinnamon
1/4 tsp. ground allspice
2 tsp. butter
1/2 cup chopped walnuts (optional)

Cake

3 cups all-purpose flour
1 Tbsp. cinnamon
2 tsp. baking soda
1 tsp. salt
2 cups sugar
1 cup butter, softened
4 large eggs
1 cup pure pumpkin puree
8 ounces sour cream
2 tsp vanilla

Glaze

1 1/2 cups powdered sugar
2 Tbsp. orange juice or 2 Tbsp milk or even 3 Tbsp

Directions

Preheat oven to 350* F, grease & flour a 12" Bundt pan.

Make Streusel: Combine brown sugar with spices and cut in butter with pastry blender until crumbly, fold in nuts. Set aside

Cake: Combine flour, cinnamon, baking soda, salt. Beat sugar and butter until light & fluffy. Add eggs and beat well. Add pumpkin, sour cream and vanilla. Gradually beat in flour mixture.

Spoon half of batter into prepared pan. Sprinkle streusel over batter, top with remaining batter. Make sure batter layer touches edges of pan.

Bake for 55 to 60 minutes or until a pick inserted in cake comes out clean. Cool for 30 minutes in pan on rack. Invert onto wire rack to cool completely

Make Glaze: Combine powdered sugar and orange juice or milk in a small bowl until smooth. Drizzle glaze over cake and sprinkle with nuts.



