



Rhubarb Cake

Taken from an old cook book

Ingredients:

- 4 cups diced rhubarb
- 1 cup sugar
- 2 (3oz) pkg. strawberry Jello
- 1 white or yellow cake mix
- 1/4 cup melted butter
- 1 cup warm water

Instructions:

Combine rhubarb with 1 cup sugar. Put in bottom of a 9x 13 inch baking pan.

Sprinkle dry cake mix over rhubarb. Then sprinkle strawberry Jello over the cake mix.

Combine melted butter with the warm water and pour over the rhubarb mixture.

Bake at 350 degrees for 1 hour.
Serve with whipped topping (optional)




