


Fireside Chat Book Discussion



One of Hella's all time easy fall recipes

Easy Apple Crisp

Ingredients

4 cups tart apples, peeled, cored and sliced
1/2 cup sugar
2 tablespoons flour
1/4 tsp salt
1 tsp cinnamon
1.2 cup regular oats
1/2 cup brown sugar
1/2 cup flour
1/4 tsp baking soda
1/4 tsp baking powder
1/4 cup cold butter

Instructions

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Place prepared apples in a medium size bowl, sprinkle with sugar, flour, salt and cinnamon and mix. Spray an 8x8 pan with cooking spray and pour apple mixture into pan.
Combine oatmeal, brown sugar, flour, soda and baking powder. Cut the butter into the mixture until crumbly. I use my hands to make this nice and crumbly. Sprinkle the mixture over the apples and bake in 350 degrees oven for 35 minutes or until golden brown.
Serve with dream whip or ice cream.

Ancient Origins of Halloween

Halloween originated with the ancient Celtic festival of Samhain. On this night people would light bonfires and wear costumes to ward of ghosts. In the eighth century, Pope Gregory III designated Nov.1 as the time to honor all saints. Soon *All Saints Day* incorporated some of the traditions of Samhain. The evening before was known as *All Hallows Eve*, later *Halloween*. Over time, Halloween evolved into a day of activities like trick-or-treating, carving jack-o-lanterns, festive gatherings, costumes and eating sweet treats.
