2016 NEBRASKA LIBRARY INTERNSHIP GRANT PROGRAM

The Nebraska Library Commission will make up to \$25,000 available to accredited Nebraska public libraries for internships through the 2016 Nebraska Library Internship Grant Program. This project is supported in part by the Institute of Museum and Library Services under the provisions of the Library Services and Technology Act as administered by the Nebraska Library Commission.

Similar to internship grant funding provided in 2011 to 2014 by the IMLS Laura Bush 21st Century Librarian Program, this internship program works to introduce high school and college students to the varied and exciting work of Nebraska libraries. The internships are intended to function as a recruitment tool in helping the student to view the library as a viable career opportunity while providing the public library with the finances (up to \$1,000 per library or branch) to provide stipends to the student(s). In the past student interns have

helped the libraries expand programs, complete projects, improve websites, and expand social media use, while bringing in fresh ideas to the library.

Grant applications will be accepted electronically starting October 23, 2015. All applications must be received no later than 5:00 PM Central Time, December 17, 2015.

Public library grantees will recruit and select their interns, however interns selected must: Be either a high school or college student, and have never been employed by a library or have never been an intern at a library (previously or currently). There are no restrictions associated with students who have served as library volunteers.

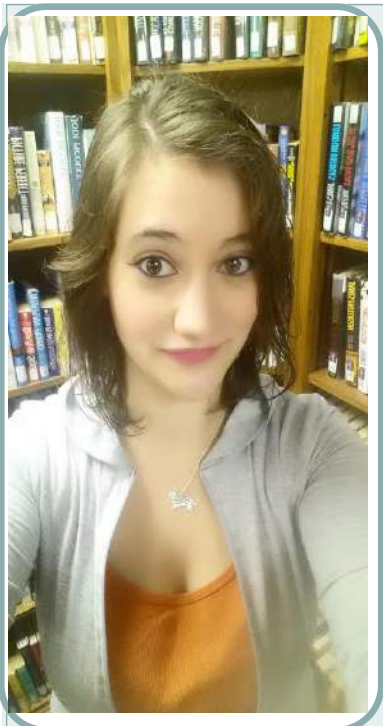

At its September 17th Library Board meeting, the trustees approved the hiring of Patti Goodier. - **C.E. SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITY NOW AVAILABLE**

- **E-RATE: WHAT'S NEW FOR 2016? WORKSHOP**

Big changes are coming again to E-rate, the federal program that provides discounts to assist schools and public libraries in the United States to obtain affordable Internet access and Connections. USAC has launched the E-Rate Productivity Center, EPC, for the 2016 Funding Year. This new online portal will be the main point of entry for all future E-rate interactions. With your organizational account you will use EPC to file forms, track your application status, communicate with USAC, and more.

What does your library need to know to use this new E-rate portal? In this workshop, Christa Burns, Nebraska's State E-rate Coordinator for Libraries, will first cover the basics of the E-rate program and then show you how to access and use your account in EPC to submit your Funding Year 2016 E-rate application.




