In August 2015, the TRaiLS board voted to implement a new service model. This new model establishes four county groups in the service area and recruits System Peer Coordinators (SPCs) for each group. The first SPC to begin was Tammi Thiem, director at Genoa Public Library. She is coordinator for Antelope, Madison, Boone, Platte, and Nance counties. The second SPC will begin in July 2016 for Stanton, Cuming, Burt, Washington, Dodge, and Colfax counties. We are currently seeking SPCs for the remaining two county groups.

The anticipated outcome for the SPC service model is efficient and relevant delivery of services while helping to build meaningful relationships among librarians in the TRaiLS service area.

Trainings, Workshops, and Meetings



- The system collaborated with the NNNC to organize the 2015 Fall Library Workshop - 50 attendees
- Worked with SELS on the 2015 Youth Services Retreat - 36 attendees
- Held six DiSPEL meetings 41 total participants
- Cooperatively sponsored Reaching Teens through Graphic Novels, a preconference at the NLA/NSLA 2015 Annual Conference, with NRLS
- The system director attended six public library board meetings to provide training for trustees
- Conducted and archived a Summer Reading webinar - 199 views (live + archived)

Many of the workshops were provided free of charge; saving 106 participants an estimated \$2,650 in registration fees.

TRaiLS created a scholarship fund to promote attendance of librarians, library staff, and trustees at local, state, regional, and national continuing education and networking events.

\$1,235 awarded in continuing education scholarships

\$2,530 available in specific funds to attend the Public Library Association's 2016 Conference, Mountain Plains Library Association's Leadership Institute, and the American Library Association's Annual Conference. An additional \$4,133 available to attend other events at an applicant's choosing.




A Facebook page was established and efforts undertaken to increase Likes and connections


Book Kit Distribution for the 2015-2016 Year


22 patrons were served in the last year spanning across the system.

822 copies from our **Book Kit Program** were lent out to system members.


The **top 3 titles** lent out (in order) were *The Meaning of Names, I am the Messenger*, and *The Hate List.*




