
### Introduction

### *The Hunger Games* By Suzanne Collins



### *Diary of a Wimpy Kid: Rodrick Rules* By Jeff Kinney


I liked it because it was funny. I think others should read it because it is a good book.

### *Five Feet Apart* By Rachael Lippincott, Mikki Daughtry, and Tobias Iaconis




It's really good because it's soooooo funny.

I love Star Wars because it's fun to look at.



I really liked the part where Nicki has her big party at the swimming pool. Nicki was really freaked out when Chloe's dad mailed her b-day invites.



This book is a great and funny book. It is very adventurous and intriguing. It's super funny and easy to read.



I like crocheting stuff. I want to make the little case. You can add different colors and you can make purses and you can make quilts. Others should read it because it shows what you can do.





This book is very funny and interesting because the cows type. And they give it to the farmer. Others should read it because they might like this book. It is funny.


