Way Back When submitted by lois milburn

January 18, 1900 - Blue Springs Weekly Sentinel-J. H. Casebeer, Publisher – Tuesday while Byron Patton was temporarily absent from the grain office at the east end, a couple of tramps crossed the bridge and helped themselves to his overcoat that he had left in the office. The loss was soon discovered and a telephone message to the Burlington depot elicited the information that a couple tramps had been seen in that vicinity and that one of them had on an overcoat turned wrong side out. By the aid of Marshal Austin they were soon corralled and the overcoat recovered. They were taken before Police Judge Craig who turned them loose provided they would leave town instanter, and they vamboosed their freight.

January 17, 1963 – Wymore Arbor State – Wymore High basketballers will take on Auburn two times during the next few days. The Zephyrs travel to Auburn Friday night for a regular Sooutheast Border Conference game and again Tuesday night for the opening round of the Conference tournament. Wymore is 1 – 6 for the season, so is Auburn. The Zephyrs absorbed their sixth straight defeat Tuesday night on the local court at the hand of Pawnee City. Wymore ran out of gas after pressing 49-47 with four minutes to go and ended 65-55. Max Martin's accuracy at the charity stripe spelled doom for the Zephyrs. He canned six of seven in the fourth quarter, 14 of 16 for the game. He got five of his free throws in the final four minutes to take the heat off the Indians. Bob Kechley's two free throws pulled the Zephyrs within two at 49-47, but Mike Dusenberg quickly dunked one and Martin got a couple of free throws to make it 43-47 seconds later. Leading the Wymore attack was Big Al Porterfield, the 6-6 Zephyr center. He scored 23 points. Rick Wood had 12, Kechley 11 for the outmanned Zephyrs. Saturday night at Seward, Coach Bob Simpson's courtmen absorbed another 10-point loss, 54 – 44 to Concordia. Porterfield got 19 that night, Kechley 13, John Bernadt added eight and Bob Maquire four.

January 18, 1973 – Wymore Arbor State – Marilyn Swope has returned to the University of Nebraska after spending the holidays with her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Al Danforth. While home Marilyn and Sally Jo Windle had a party for some of their former classmates. They attended the Southern-Auburn wrestlilng match and returned to Marilyn's to spend the night. Those present were Cindy Rutan, Laura Boettcher, Debbie Hays, Kathy Keller, Debbie Mulanax, Kelly Coffey and Sue Reedy.


