


Roger Dale Warford Obituary SUBMITTED BY LAUGHLIN-HOEVET FUNERAL HOME

What is Prayer?

Have you ever had a situation which drove you to your knees in prayer? I have felt this way many times, like when my sister was diagnosed with cancer or when my father passed away. Prayer is sometimes depicted in movies and TV, usually in a positive light. We frequently resort to prayer when it seems we have nowhere else to go except to fold our hands and bow before God. Often, we tell others, "I will pray for you."

What is prayer? Saint Therese of Lisieux, who lived 1873-1897 in France, said that "for me, prayer is a surge of the heart; it is a simple look turned toward heaven, it is a cry of recognition and of love, embracing both trial and joy."

All prayer is founded upon humility. Humility is the basis of our prayer. In humility we say to God that we surrender everything over to him and ask him to take care of it. In the Book of Romans, Saint Paul acknowledges on our behalf that we do not know how to pray as we ought. Saint Augustine said that "man is a beggar before God."

The biblical passage of the Samaritan woman at the well who encounters Jesus has much to teach us about prayer. While the woman seeks water, we come to the wellsprings of God's goodness seeking to encounter him. This encounter is the essence of prayer where God seeks us; we can say that God thirsts for us. Jesus first seeks us, and when we respond in kind, we enter into prayer with the Almighty One.

In the woman at the well episode, Jesus says, "You would have asked him, and he would have given you living water." Our prayer of petition in a paradoxical way is the response we have to God's thirst for us. In faith, we respond to God's plan of salvation for us via our prayer to him.

When we say we have prayed from the heart, it means we have had a powerful experience in prayer. The heart is our dwelling-place, it is where we live. Scripture teaches again and again that our prayer arises from our hearts. In fact, the heart as being the source of prayer is mentioned in the Bible more than a thousand times! The heart is the place of decision, of truth, of encounter, and of covenant with God.

The new covenant of the people of God is sealed in the Blood of Christ. By his covenant, we are in communion with him. Prayer is the living relationship we have with the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Our baptism has united us with Christ and that unity is continued through a life of prayer.

St. Paul tells us to pray unceasingly. This is difficult, but by God's grace we can do it.


