The Steering Committee of the Friends of the Wymore Library met on August 8, 1979. FOWL was organized on November 5, 1979. The Wymore Public Library is vested in the Wymore City Council and the Board of Library Trustees. FOWL helps to maintain an association of persons interested in books and libraries; to focus public attention on library services, facilities, and needs and to stimulate gifts of books, magazines, desirable collections, endowments, and bequests. FOWL is a separate supporting entity from the city of Wymore. All funds raised by the organization are spent directly on materials needed for the operation of the library. In the past, the group has bought security cameras, carpets, storm windows, a microfilm reader, 44 reels of microfilm newspapers, paid the monthly telephone bill for the elevator phone, helped with Spooktacular, Sam Wymore Days, Summer Reading Program, book sales, and bake sales. FOWL is researching the purchase of a newer or new film reader/scanner as the present film reader is rather out-dated and not compatible to most of the library computers. FOWL is a non-profit organization and meets the second Tuesday of January, April, July, and October.

Ways to Pray

“Bless the Lord, my soul, and all my being bless his holy name. Bless the Lord, my soul, and forget not all his benefits.” These words are from the beginning of Psalm 103. This article will consider prayers of blessing, adoration, petition, and adoration.

A prayer of blessing is man’s response to God’s gifts. This type of prayer expresses God’s gifts and man’s acceptance of them. Because God blesses us, we can bless him in return. As we pray prayers of blessing, they ascend in the Holy Spirit through Christ to the Father. Then, God blesses us in return by the grace of the Holy Spirit descending upon us through Christ from the Father.

Adoration acknowledges that God is the Creator and that we are his creatures. We exalt the greatness of the God who made us. In psalm 24, we see the Lord referred to as the “King of Glory.” We remain in respectful silence in the presence of the King of Glory as we adore him. When we adore God, we show humility. We say, “God is God, and I am not.”

When we petition God in prayer, we are turning back to him after having sinned. Prayer of petition is when we ask, beseech, plead, invoke, entreat, cry out, and even “struggle in prayer,” as St. Paul writes about in Romans chapter 15, verse 30. In Romans 8, Paul speaks of how we do not know how to pray as we ought, but that the Holy Spirit intercedes for us with inexpressible groanings.

In the prayer of intercession, we ask God’s favor on behalf of another. We commonly say to people, “I will pray for you.” This is a prayer of intercession. Jesus is the one intercessor with the Father. Our prayers of intercession join with Our Lord’s perfect intercession with his Father.

Our father Abraham interceded with God, especially when it seemed like God’s promise of many descendants was not going to happen. Our hearts are attuned to God’s mercy when we intercede. The Book of Hebrews speaks of a great cloud of witnesses, and it is within this communion of saints that we intercede in Christ to the Father.

We pray in an intercessory way because the early Christians did. It grew their fellowship with one another. We are called to intercede with God even for our persecutors and for those who reject the Gospel.

Prayers of blessing, adoration, petition, and intercession are great gifts to Christians!

The Reporter, 1881 - A gentleman from Omaha has purchased five acres of ground of Samuel Wymore, east of the town of Wymore on the bank of the river and will erect a packing house at once. This is something that has long been needed. **** This week we add the letter (E R) and appear with our old name, The Wymore Reporter. The name Reporter has been used by me for the past three years as the name of my paper, with the exception of a few weeks that the injunction suit of W. H. Ashby, et. al. against C. M. Murdock, et. al. was pending which was dismissed at the last term of District Court, which removes all lawful obstructions to my resuming the name Reporter and I repeat that I have never disclosed of the name, the subscription of the advertising of the Wymore Reporter to any person whatever. The slight unpleasantness now being over it is expected that the future will still further establish the right of the Reporter to life and greatly increase its usefulness. C. M. Murdock.

The Weekly Reporter, 1893 - Summit addition to Wymore is one of the finest locations for resident property in the city. The streetcar line from Wymore to Blue Springs runs through that part of the city. See ad of Murdock, Pasko & Murdock for prices and terms of sale of lots in that part of the city. **** There will be church services in German at the lecture room of the M. E. church on Friday evening, 8 p.m., to which all German speaking friends are cordially invited. **** On Monday the short, the tall, the large, the small, the good natured and the good looking people are all going to see the Great Western Show. Only 25 cents admission to the Great Western Show. Two performances, first at 2 o'clock in the afternoon and then at 7:30 in the evening.

The Weekly Reporter, 1895 - James Casebeer, editor of the Blue Springs Sentinel, was a pleasant caller Monday. Come again, Jim. **** The settlers on the eastern part of the reservation have received notice that payment must be made on their land within ten days. **** Anyone wishing a boy to run errands, deliver packages, or do light work such as is usually done by messenger boys, can have their work done promptly by giving me a call. Leave orders at the Tousalin Barber Shop. Willie Gerbing.

Blue Springs Weekly Sentinel, 1917 - When a young lady loses her self-respect so far as to appear on the street of a city attired in a pair of black high top boots and black skirt and coat that barely reaches below her knee with the interval between the skirt and boots portrayed in a pair of sno-white stockings, we believe to be the limit. This was the scene that attracted most everyone's notice a few days ago on our street. Imagine the spectacle, gentle reader. If anything could have attracted more attention, we failed to have seen it so far. To our notion the lady in question might just as well have carried a sign printed in large letters, bearing the legend, "Look At My Legs." If this is style, we believe the gentle sex should put a ban on that particular style, from the fact that it is likely to draw unkind remarks. Perhaps the price of dress goods has advanced until the skirt of usual length is prohibitive. In this case we would suggest that black stockings be worn in place of white -- they attract less attention.

The Odell Weekly Wave, 1917 - A. Germeroth & Son advertised: 3 cans Wax Beans for 27 cents, 3 cans Green Beans for 27 cents, 1 dozen oranges for 10 cents. Bring us your produce. We pay highest market price. **** The Odell Senior Class Play was "Mrs. Briggs of the Poultry Yard." Actors were Elsie Schlangen, Ralph Layton, Frank Shalla, Mabel Miller, Eleanor Barry, Albert Kostal, Robert Rosecrans, Estella Barry, Mae Murphy, Francis McGinley, and Hazel Hinds. **** Attention is again called to the speed limit of automobiles and motorcycles of 10 mile per hour and the marshal has orders to arrest all violating the ordinances covering same. All cars must be parked in center of street. J. H. Gillain, Chairman

The Odell Oracle, 1926 - The Luther Day Celebration was held at Kostal's grove in Odell Sunday as advertised. The shower at noon greatly cut down the attendance as the heavier rains south prevented many from coming....There was congregational singing, scripture reading by Rev. F. W. Korbitz, pastor of Our Savior congregation, vocal duets by Misses Lydia Hansen and Clara Zirenberg of Fairbury, sermon in English by Rev. H. W. Degner of Hampton, short address in German by Rev. H. Schabacker of Hebron. Music was furnished by the Horseshoe band.

The Wymore Arbor State, 1936 - Signs of Springs: A number of our merchants are beginning their spring house cleaning. Mayor Reese is having a new freezer case and ice machine installed in his market. He also has added a couple of new blocks. When completed he will have the latest thing in refrigeration. Cecil Neumann has his yardstick out again, this time he is having a dress rack built on the north side of his room. Rachel Nolan, of the Myr-Rae beauty shop is making arrangements for some new equipment and will have the interior of her shop decorated and rearranged. The Rexall Drug store has installed a motor on their wall paper trimmer and can now trim wall paper in double quick time.
