1. **Summer Reading Club** registrations are going well. There are over 300 children registered to participate in the reading contests and programs and registrations continue to come in daily. Funding for all of the programs have been secured from local donors, including a grant from Walmart for \$1,000.

The first activities saw:

110 attendees for a Movie Day;  
97 participants in "Build your own Robot Day";  
22 children attended the Junior Friends of the library lock-in.

2. The **Adult Summer Reading Smackdown** began June 1<sup>st</sup>, and runs through August 30. Adult readers are invited to register and receive a punch card. Once they fill a five-punch card they are eligible for weekly drawings and their count helps York bring the trophy home! Join us in this fun summer activity.
