2. StoryWalk 2019 books are selected and being prepared to be delivered on the trail each month through the year. The January/February book is *When the Wind Blows* by Linda Booth Sweeney.
3. In partnership with the Friends of the Library Kilgore Memorial Library hosted its first annual Noon Year's Eve party on December 31. With more than 100 participants the event was a huge success.
