Prepared for the November 15, 2018
York City Council meeting

1. The Elmer Baker display case is filled with a collection of Bobble Heads of movie characters with movie or the book the character is from. The Kent Bedient Gallery has a display from the York County Ministerial Alliance.
2. StoryWalk 2018 books are selected and being prepared to be delivered on the trail each month through the year. The November/December book is *The Counting to Christmas* by Nancy Tafuri .
3. Fall activities are in full swing at the library. Special events in October included a Steampunk Pumpkin event. Approximately 20 participants of all ages had a great time creating their pumpkins. The Not So Scary, Very Fun Trick or Treat party for toddlers was a huge success and the afterschool trick or treat time was fun for all. There was a photo op with a skeleton and a dark hallway filled with ghosts and balloons to traverse in order to find a table with treats at the end.
4. A new addition to our story time lineup is a Night Time Story Time held every other Tuesday evening from 6:30 to 7:30 pm. Carol Baker is leading this event with 8 to 10 participants each time.
5. The special education classes from the York Public Schools continue to come to this library. There are two classes with more than twenty students attending each of the library workshops.
6. The fall series of Read and Rec is taking place on Tuesdays in November. The Parks and Rec and Library have partnered with the Boost program from YES to bring 30 children to this program each week.
7. Discussion will take place at the November library board meeting about hours of service. We are losing a part-time staff member in November and there are not enough staff to full staff all the hours we currently have.
