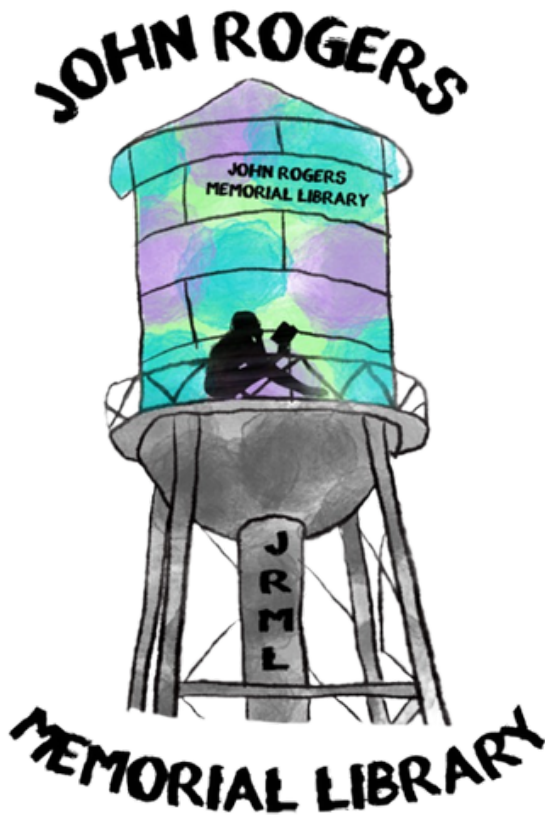

# Banned Books Week

In honor of Banned Books Week (Oct. 1-7), John Rogers Memorial Library invites everyone to celebrate and rededicate ourselves to our right to read, listen to, view, write, create and otherwise experience and express whatever we choose.

This right is guaranteed by the U.S. Constitution. For years, many people in this country assumed that censorship was a thing of the past or at least that "it doesn't happen here." Each year, the American Library Association honored Banned Books Week largely as a reminder of historical events and an encouragement to remain aware of the potential threat of censorship and the importance of freedom of speech.

But in the past few years, our nation has faced a striking increase in censorship. Individuals, organizations, candidates and elected officials are requesting, demanding and sometimes legislating that public libraries, school libraries, classrooms and book stores remove or restrict access to particular titles.

In addition to addressing the harm that censorship causes, Banned Books Week celebrates the fact that over time, in the majority of cases, books have remained available precisely because people spoke out for the freedom to read. Banned Books Week brings together the entire book community — readers, writers, students, librarians, educators, booksellers, publishers and journalists — in shared support of the value of free and open access to information, entertainment and inspiration.

The John Rogers Memorial library offers a large, rich and varied selection of choices to explore every day, not just during banned book week.

Circulation matters! Circulation data can be used to support keeping challenged books on shelves and to justify ordering more books by the same authors or on the same topic.

### BUY A BANNED BOOK

Censorship doesn't just harm libraries and schools; it also impacts writers, publishers, and booksellers. Support the people who make and sell books by buying them!

You can also donate the books you purchase to:

- **Public and school libraries:** Contact your local library or school to find out what they need and how to donate.
- **Little Free Library:** Use their free app ([LittleFreeLibrary.org/app/](https://LittleFreeLibrary.org/app/)) to find a book-sharing box near you!
- **Fundraisers:** Many public libraries are supported by groups that use donated books to raise money.
- **A banned book giveaway or bookmobile:** Call your local bookstore to see if they're hosting a giveaway or supporting a bookmobile.

## IF YOU HAVE 30 MINUTES...

### WRITE A LETTER OR E-MAIL

Write to local school and library boards and elected officials to ask them to defend the right to read for the entire community. Make a public statement for the right to read by writing a letter to the editor in your local paper. Finally, a letter can show library staff, educators, authors, and vulnerable readers that you support them!

### PLAN TO ATTEND A MEETING

While decisions about book bans and library policies are being made at all levels of government, some of the biggest battles are being fought locally. Plan to attend local board and city council meetings to let officials know that many people (including you!) support access to information and oppose censorship.

## Legacy Giving

The John Rogers Memorial Library hopes that you will consider including a gift to the library in your will or estate plan. The Legacy giving program offers an exciting opportunity to establish your enduring personal legacy of reading, life-long learning and imagination for future generations of children, adults, and families in our community. Without the legacies left behind and created by past Dodge residents, the John Rogers Memorial Library would not be the thriving community resource that it is today. By including the Library in your estate plan, you can make sure the library provides outstanding service in the decades ahead!

### BEQUESTS – PUT THE LIBRARY IN YOUR WILL

There are three basic kinds of bequests: specific, residuary, and contingent.

**Specific bequest** – a gift of a particular dollar amount

**Residuary bequest** – a gift of part or all of what remains in your estate after debts, expenses, and specific bequests have been paid, stated as a percentage of the residuary estate

**Contingent bequest** – a gift which takes effect only if the beneficiaries named in your will die before you do

The residuary bequest is the most common and simplest. You control what percentage of your estate is given to whom, and the size of a bequest is automatically adjusted. In the event of unexpected changes in the size of your estate, you would have the peace of mind that your intentions would be carried out without the estate running out of assets to distribute as you have directed.

To make a charitable bequest to support the John Rogers Memorial Library, simply include a statement in your will or revocable trust agreement such as:

*I hereby bequeath to the John Rogers Memorial Library, located at 703 2<sup>nd</sup> Street, Dodge NE, 68633, the sum of \$\$\$ (or, as an alternative, \_\_% of my residuary estate).*

### Making Your Gift to the Library

Please, let us know that you have made the John Rogers Memorial Library a full or partial beneficiary of your will, trust, life insurance policy or retirement fund. Your gift need not be irrevocable and we understand that situations change. It is your current expression of commitment to the Library that is important.

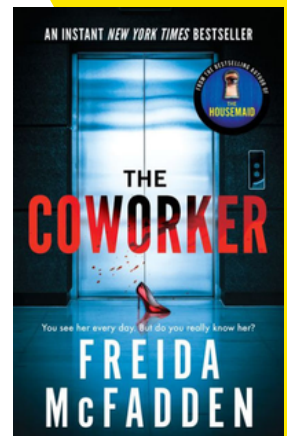
Dawn Schiff is strange.

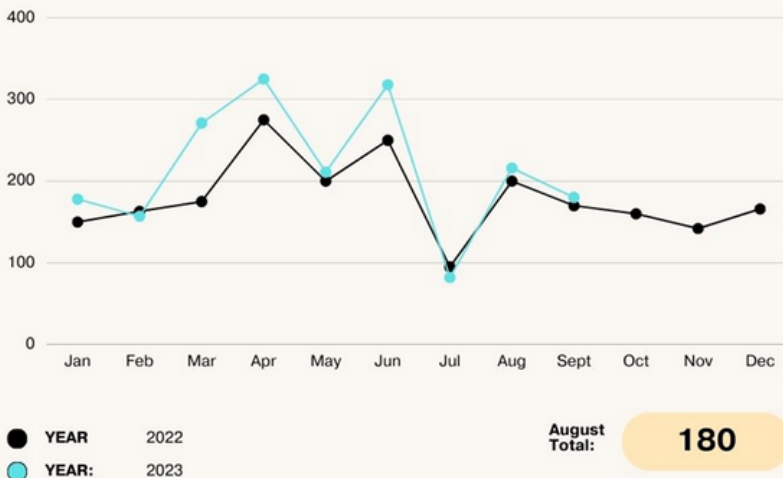
