ABOUT THE BOOK

- The last battle between the Pawnee and Sioux
- The Battle of Blue Water

Others share the author's own experiences – goose hunting, writing, camping, and summer hikes through rattlesnake country – growing up in Western Nebraska and living in the state all his life.

Andrew recently completed a novel, *Tumbleweed Lexicon*, set in the Sandhills.
