Instructions for Application for Milford High School Seniors

Requirements and Provisions of the Webermeier Scholarship:

- Must be a current full time Milford High School Senior.*
- Must have a current GPA of **3.5** or higher and be ranked in the top **15** in your class.*
- Must have a good standing in academics as well as good behavior at school and public law enforcement.*
- The recipient must comply with all requests as stated in the Will and Testament of William Webermeier or risk forfeiture of the scholarship.*
- William Webermeier requested that each recipient receiving a scholarship place at least one flower on his grave and on the grave of his mother, Minnie for Memorial Day. The Salem United Methodist Church cemetery is located two miles north and three miles west of Highway 6 and 15 junction on "A" Street Road.*
- Applicants may be scheduled for a personal interview with the Scholarship Committee.*
- Leave due to extenuating circumstances (Medical, Missions, etc) will be allowed with written notification prior to the time of the next renewal period. The Webermeier Scholarship offers up to 4 consecutive years of funding and any amount that would have been awarded during the leave of absence will be forfeited. Upon return, an applicant may petition and inform the Webermeier Board that they wish to proceed with receiving the scholarship and the Webermeier Committee will review any remaining eligibility and make a determination accordingly.*
- Recipients of the Webermeier Scholarship may reapply for the scholarship each year they are eligible.*
- The Webermeier Scholarship Committee shall designate who shall receive a Webermeier Scholarship.*

Procedures for Application:

- Prepare a one-page **Letter of Application** stating your reason you would like to become a Webermeier Scholar, including the reason you are going to college, your area(s) of study and your need of financial assistance.*
- Complete the **Biography check list** ...with your information and include background for your educational history, school activities, clubs or team involvement, officer or leadership appointments, accomplishments, employment experience, volunteer work experience, organization involvement, personal interest, goals and any other information you would like to share.*
- Submit a copy of your **Academic Reports** (current Transcript and all ACT Scores and Class Ranking) to the Scholarship Committee under a covered seal to be included in your application.*
- Collect **FOUR Teacher Recommendations**. Use the attached Teacher Recommendation form for teachers in which you have had High School Class or High School Activity experience. Each recommendation should be under a covered and signed sealed envelope to be included in your application.*
- Collect **ONE Personal Letter of Recommendation** from someone that knows you well such as an employer, pastor, community person, etc.. This recommendation should be under a covered signed sealed envelope to be included in your application.*

All requirements should be received at the Milford City Office by the date listed at top of page

- Letter of Application and Biography from you, including current contact information.*
- All three Academic Reports listed on your MHS Transcript*
- Four Teacher and One Personal Recommendation from your references.*
