1. The Elmer Baker Display Case is two Lego Creations for the Chamber contest during YorkFest. The Kent Bedient Gallery has a poster display commemorating the $20^{\text {th }}$ anniversary of $9 / 11$ from the $9 / 11$ Memorial \& Museum. This display will be up through the month of September.
2. The early childhood educators from the Headstart Program P.L.A.Y. hosted a family social in the Early Childhood Discovery Center in September.
3. The Friends of the Library have delivered new books to each baby born at York County hospitals for years. The books are now part of a packet crated to promote reading through the 1,000 Books Before Kindergarten and the Early Childhood Discovery Center. Each folder contains reading logs, a bookmark, and notepad and of course a book!
4. Preschool Story Time held its first in-person event on September 7. This popular event at the library was enjoyed by 13 children and their adult caregivers. Because we realize that not everyone is comfortable attending indoor, live events with crowds Mr. and Mrs. Baker are also producing a second story time on Facebook Live on Thursday's at 10:30 am. The craft from these sessions are available for families to pick up at the library so the children can have the full experience of our event.
5. The Vision 2025 committee that grew from the Community Conversation hosted at the library continues to work toward finding the needs of the community that the library might use to create new levels of service to meet the identified needs. Small groups are working together on topics of Lifelong learning, Social services, Career paths and Technology/Innovation. The next meeting of the large group is scheduled for Tuesday, September 13 at 11:30.
6. Library staff members, Tyler Nelsen and Deb Robertson are working to complete a RFP to include a request for FCC e-rate Special Construction Program funding. By completing this request from the FCC Kilgore Library will also be eligible for an additional 10\% discount from the Nebraska Public Service Commission's matching grant Program (NUSF117) and with the state grant we will then be eligible for an additional $10 \%$ discount from the FCC. This program has the potential to bring high-speed fiber internet to the public library for everyone we serve.
